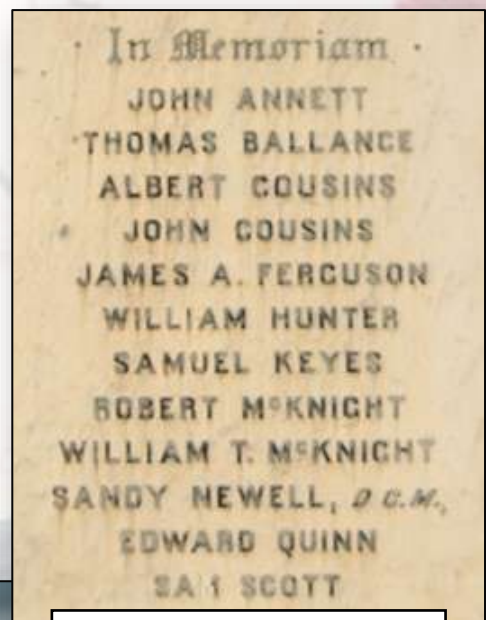
**Born:** Kilkeel, Co. Down

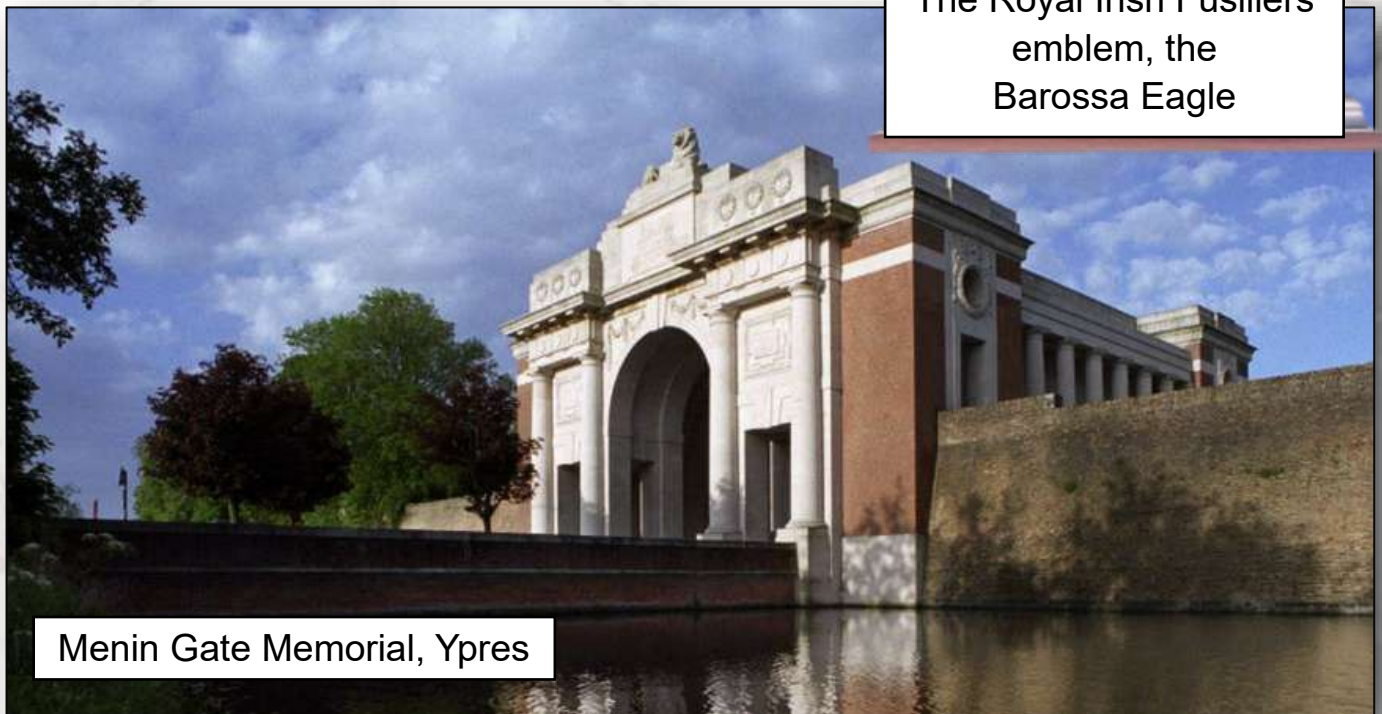


## Killed in Action 14th May 1915

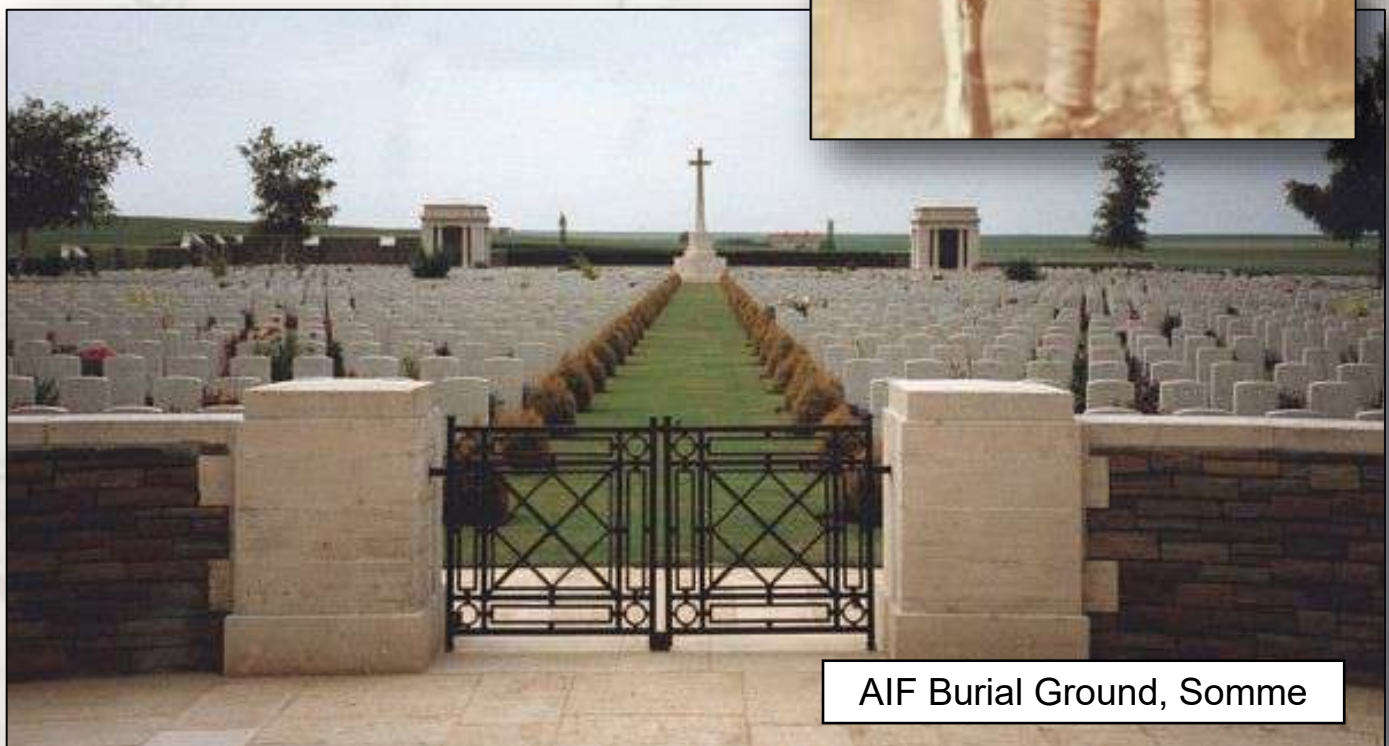
