**Able Seaman; Royal Navy**

**Age:** 26

**Born:** Annalong

**Parents:** Son of Freeman and Ellen, HM Guard Station, Hythe, Kent



**Died of Wounds 22nd September 1914**

Able Seaman Everall, Service Number 233891, HMS Aboukir, Royal Navy, was Killed in Action at Sea. He is commemorated on the Chatham Naval memorial in England; Panel 2.

# Fitzgibbon, Christopher

**Private; Connaught Rangers**

**Kilkeel**

**Died 17th August 1914**

Private Fitzgibbon, Service Number 9750, 1st Battalion Connaught Rangers, is believed to be the first Ulster soldier to have died in the First World War. Whilst on route to France by train from his station in India, he dies from heatstroke. He is buried in the Ferozepore Military Cemetery, India; Cemetery/ memorial reference Plot F Grave 337.





# Graham, John

**Private; Royal Irish Fusiliers**

**Age:** 24

**Born:** Kilkeel, Co. Down

**Parents:** Son of James Graham,  
Greencastle Street, Kilkeel

**Killed in Action 26th April 1916**

Private Graham, Service Number 10696, was Killed in Action serving with the 1st Battalion Royal Irish Fusiliers when a shell exploded in his trench. He is buried at Berles-au-Boise Churchyard Extension, Pas de Calais, France; Cemetery/ memorial reference D.7.

# Kearney, John

Rifleman, Royal Irish Rifles

Born: Kilkeel, Co. Down

**Killed in Action 10th March 1918**

Rifleman Kearney, Service Number 9318, was Killed in Action while serving with the 1st Battalion Royal Irish Rifles. He is commemorated at le Touret Memorial, Pas de Calais, France; Cemetery/ memorial reference Panel 42 and 42.

Rifleman, Royal Irish Rifles

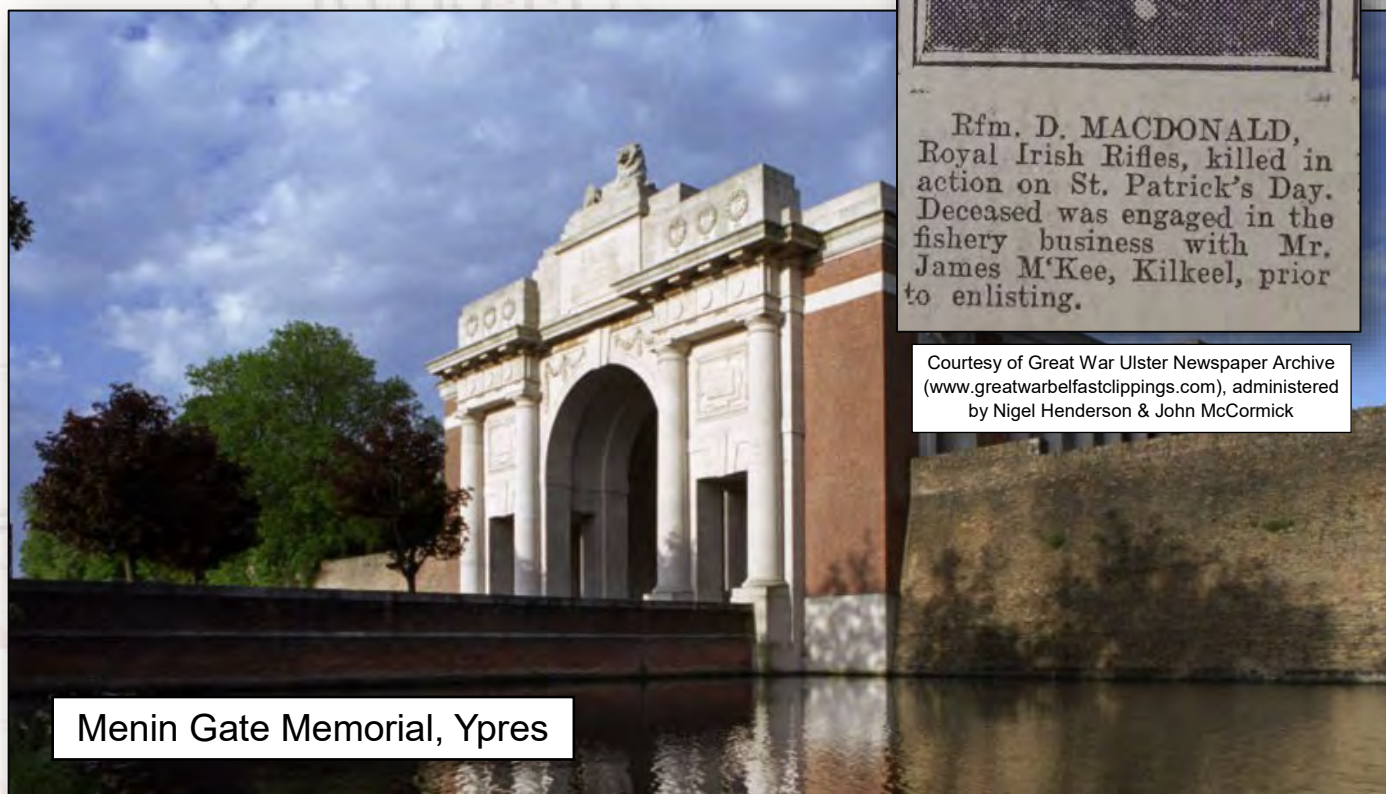
Resident in Kilkeel prior to the Great War. Employed with James McKee in the fishery business.

**Killed in Action 21st March 1916**

Rifleman McDonald, Service Number 7137, was Killed in Action while serving with D Coy 2nd Battalion Royal Irish Rifles. He is commemorated at Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres; Cemetery/ memorial reference Panel 40.

# Rooney, Peter

**Rifleman, Royal Irish Rifles**

**Age:** 20

**Born:** Kilkeel, Co. Down

**Parents:** Son of Laurence and S. Rooney

**Killed in Action 1st July 1916**

Rifleman Rooney, Service Number 18704, was Killed in Action while serving with A Coy 14th Royal Irish Rifles. Served along with his brother Tommy Rooney, who was also wounded on the 1st July at the Battle of the Somme.

**Killed in Action 28th April 2017**

Private McDowell, Service Number 27/11117, was Killed in Action while serving with the 27th (Tyneside Irish) Battalion, Northumberland Fusiliers. He is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, France; Cemetery/ memorial reference Bay 2 and 3.

# Scandridge, William John

**Private; Canadian Forestry Corps**

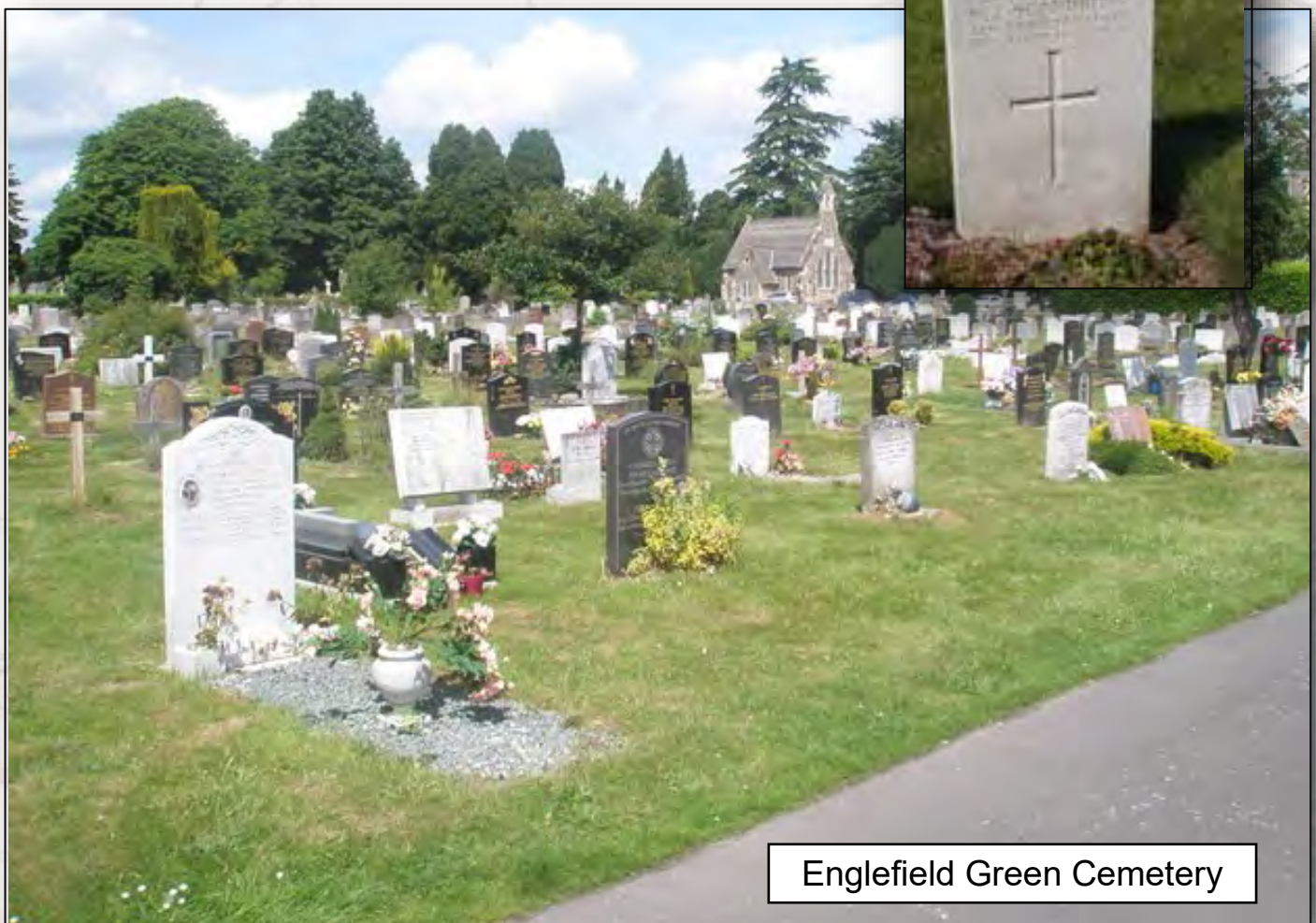
**Age:** 26

Private Scandridge, Service Number 2498678, died of Pneumonia, and is buried in Englefield Green Cemetery, England. The Canadian Forestry Corps had a nearby hospital.

**Born:** Kilkeel, Co. Down

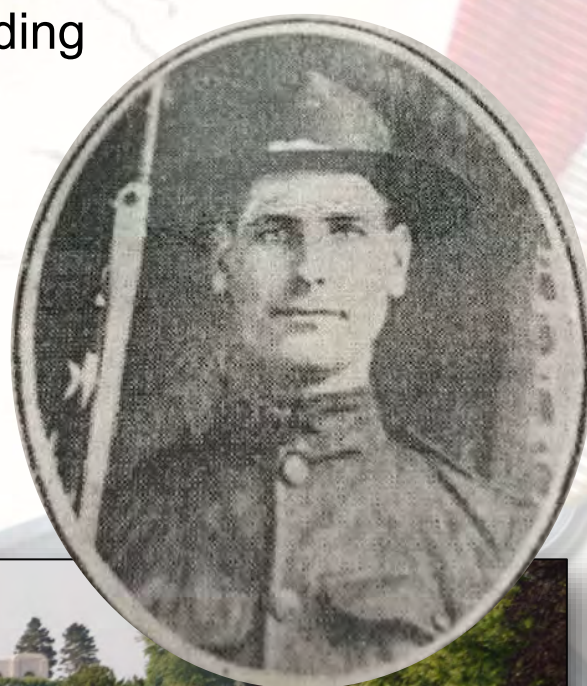
**Parents:** Jordan and Elizabeth Newell

## **Killed in Action 11th October 1918**

Sergeant Newell was Killed in Action while serving with the 38th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Division. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for leading a squad of nine men through an enemy barrage, capturing five machine guns and 33 prisoners. He is buried at Meuse Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne, France; Cemetery/ memorial reference Plot C Row 7 Grave 27.
