

## Famous Ulster-Scots O' Mourne

Nurse Margaret Anderson Royal Red Cross, 1881-1956

**A True Ulster-Scot** 

Margaret Anderson had very strong
Ulster-Scots roots. She was born in Ballinran,
the eldest child of Joseph and Elizabeth
Anderson and became known as
'Mourne's Florence Nightingale'. Her
grandparents had come over from
Scotland to settle in Ulster in the mid
1800s and established a tuck mill
beside the Kilkeel River in Ballinran.
It was here that Margaret was reared in
a place known locally as 'Anderson's
Holms' and of course 'Holm' is the
Ulster-Scots word meaning 'A flat area

beside a river'.



After leaving Ballinran Presbyterian School,
Margaret worked as a medical receptionist in Warringstown, where
she developed an interest in nursing and later made her way to
England to undertake training to qualify as a State Registered
Nurse. Margaret's war service commenced in 1916 when she joined
the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Reserve.
Margaret Anderson was a compassionate and dedicated nurse who
regularly went above and beyond the call of duty in her quest to
ensure the best possible care for injured soldiers, sailors and
airmen. She was awarded the Royal Red Cross by King George V for
her distinguished contribution to the war effort. This was the
highest award that could be conferred on a woman for war service
and Queen Alexandra presented Margaret with a special book,
signed with a personal message of gratitude for her endeavour.

After the war, Margaret nursed in various places including Iraq before she returned home to Mourne in 1926, where she became Matron of the hospital at the Silent Valley. At the outbreak of World



War Two, despite Margaret's age of fifty eight, she re-joined the Nursing Reserve, taking part in several sorties across the English Channel during the evacuation of Dunkirk. Margaret passed away in 1956 and was buried in the grounds of Mourne Presbyterian Meeting House and is now commemorated on Mourne Presbyterian Church Cenotaph for her service in both World Wars.
